Dear Stewart Descendants,

The 93rd Annual Reunion of the Walter Stewart Clan will be held during the weekend of August 7-8, 1999 at New Harmony Presbyterian Church in Fountain Inn, S.C. We hope you will join us for the family sharing and tour on Saturday and the traditional reunion meeting and picnic dinner on Sunday. We have some real treats planned for the family this year.

We will meet at the Fairview Presbyterian Church community building near Fountain Inn for our Saturday morning registration, for the afternoon tour, and for our catered supper Saturday night. The reunion business meeting will be at New Harmony Presbyterian Church on Sunday morning, with a picnic afterwards on the church grounds - or inside, in case of rain.

Vans will be provided for those who would like to go on the Saturday afternoon tour. This year we will go back to the area in lower Laurens County near the Enoree River where Walter Stewart, Sr. first settled when he arrived with his family from Northern Ireland. We will visit the Stewart family home church, Bethany Presbyterian Church, and its cemetery where several Stewart ancestors are buried. The route will take us through the Sandy Springs community and Martins Crossroads. We will drive by the home of 322 Hasting Dial Stewart and his wife Alice Rebecca Martin. We also visit the old McClintock homeplace near Ora. Stewart descendant Harold McClintock, Jr. and his wife Susan have revitalized their ancestral home by establishing the Homeplace Garden Center, which features gardens with herbs and perennials, plus a gift shop and antiques. Plan to relax on the front porch with some homemade lemonade.

Saturday night, we will gather for our family supper at the Fairview Presbyterian Church community building. This is a time of fellowship, renewing family ties, and sharing of family news and pictures.

Our Sunday program at New Harmony Presbyterian Church features Rev. Leroy Stewart Of Easley, SC who is very active in the restoration and history of old mills. He is the proprietor of an old gristmill, where he still uses waterpower to grind corn into grits and corn meal. He will trace the development of these mills from their origin in the Old World to their use by settlers on the American frontiers. Although Mr. Stewart has no known connection with the Walter Stewart family, there can be little doubt that our ancestors go back to the same origin.

Chief Historian Mary Rawlinson has some good news this year about efforts to computerize the Stewart Family records. Bill Rawlinson asks that we continue our efforts to record the military service of all family members, for the benefit of future family historians. The family historians also ask that you send in new births, marriages and deaths in your family. Please see the update sheets elsewhere in this newsletter for information on how to submit this data for your family.

We look forward to seeing you during Stewart reunion weekend to renew old ties and celebrate new ones. As it has for 91 years, the call still goes out, bring a full picnic basket and join us!

1999 REUNION ACTIVITIES

Saturday Registration. Saturday activities this year will be at the Fairview Church Community Building across the road from the church (see map, page 3). Join us there Saturday morning for registration, informal introductions, handing in family update sheets, etc.

Saturday Lunch. This is "on your own." You may want to bring your own brown baggies from home or one of the fast food places on I-385 and join us for an informal lunch at the Fairview community building before the afternoon tour.

Saturday Tour. Tour vans will leave from the Fairview Church community building at 1:00 pm on Saturday, August 8 and return at 5:00 pm. If you plan to go, your reservations must be mailed by July 15 (see order blank, p. 7). We will visit Bethany Presbyterian Church and Cemetery in lower Laurens County. This is the original home church of the Stewart Family near the land where Walter Stewart, Sr. settled after arriving from Northern Ireland about 1788. We will also visit the Homeplace Garden Center in Ora at the kind invitation of the owners, 2521911 Harold McClintock, Jr. and his wife Susan. On the way back we will ride by the homeplace of 322 Hasting Dial Stewart and his wife Alice Rebecca Martin in the Martins Crossroads community.

Saturday Night Supper. This will be an informal catered supper at the Fairview Church community building Saturday at 6:30 pm. Bring the whole family, and pictures and family news to share with all of us. Older family members especially welcome! A buffet supper of sandwich makings, salads, dessert and beverages will be served. If you plan to attend the supper, please have your reservations in by July 15 (see order blank, p. 6).

Sunday Clan Meeting at New Harmony Presbyterian Church. Chief Charles Stewart will open the meeting at 11:00 a.m. and will ask for business reports. Our speaker will be Rev. Leroy Stewart of Easley, SC, owner of Golden Creek Mill, an old time water wheel gristmill originally built in the early 1800's. Mr. Stewart is a member of the Society for the Preservation of Old Mills (SPOOM). He has helped produce a SCETV video that features his family gristmill. The video traces the history of these mills from their Old World origins to the New World. Mr. Stewart has presented this video for many historical groups. He is an entertaining and well-informed speaker.

Sunday Picnic Dinner at 12 noon. No reservations necessary. There will be a goodwill offering to cover incidental reunion expenses. Bring picnic food to share with all. If you are coming from out of town, there are several restaurants and grocery delicatessens nearby where take-out items may be purchased. Ice tea and utensils will be provided.

NOTE FROM THE CHIEF HISTORIAN

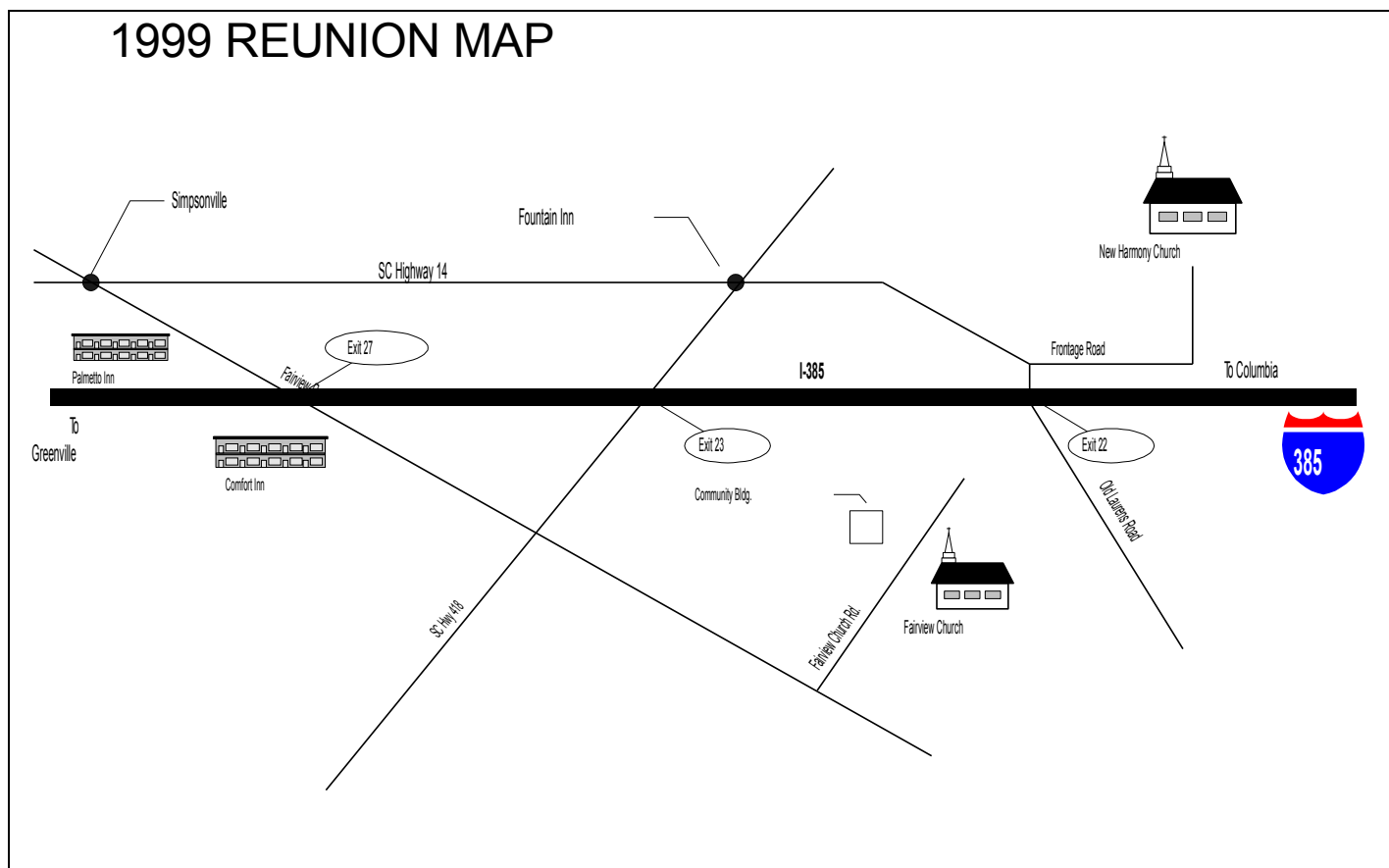
I am delighted to announce the Stewart Family House records will be available on 3-1/2" floppy diskettes in time for the Reunion. This long awaited event comes about through the talent and hard work of my daughter Judy Lesslie of Charleston, ably assisted by her niece Chelsea Clark of Dorchester, SC. The diskettes contain the original Stewart family records from the 1982 book, **The Walter Stewart Family History**, with many glaring typographical errors corrected. No later records have yet been added. I plan to retire this summer, and one of my first projects will be to begin updating the Family records for the second computerized edition.

Expected costs are preliminary, but the diskettes will be about \$5 per House. The House pictures from the book will also be available on diskette for about \$5 per diskette (some Houses will require more than one diskette). We can supply files in many popular word processor formats, including Microsoft Word, WordPerfect, and Word for Macintosh. The pictures will be in JPG format. After the Reunion, the House records will continue to be available on diskette by mail order at the same cost per diskette plus \$5 for shipping. Sometime late in 1998, we also plan to offer the records of the Stewart family to 1982 (including pictures) in CD format. The pre-release price is expected to be about \$30 plus shipping.

1998 Reunion Minutes

The 92nd Annual Reunion of the Walter Stewart Clan was held on August 8th and 9th, 1998 at Fairview Presbyterian Church and the Church Community Building. Chief Charles B. Stewart opened the Sunday business meeting with Hymn No. 76 and the Lord's Prayer. Chief Charles then requested members present from each house to stand for count. The report given by Registrar Bill Rawlinson for the Sunday meeting:

The oldest member in attendance was 3734 Mrs. Sarah Stewart Godfrey. The youngest in attendance was 32222312 Hastings Paul Stewart. States represented were South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Louisiana, Tennessee, Virginia, Kentucky, and Indiana. Four families tied for traveling the greatest distance. They came from Harvey, LA, Jeffersonville, IN, Levittown, PA, and Old Bridge, NJ.

Chief Historian Mary S. Rawlinson reported that her daughter, Judy Lesslie, would be creating a Web page for the Stewart Family as we are moving into the computer age. Judy will be taking suggestions from people about the sort of things to go into the Web page. Her suggestions are family photographs, pictures of the reunions and written materials. Reports for each house were heard from three historians in attendance and the Chief Historian read the remaining reports. There are plans to have the Stewart Book transferred for computer use by the next reunion. The problem exists in converting scanned text into the computer.

John T. Hellams gave the report from the Nominating Committee and elections were held for three offices: Secretary-La Marr Brooks, Central, SC, Treasurer-Doug Stewart, Fountain Inn, SC and Chief Historian-Mary S. Rawlinson, Columbia, SC. All were unanimously elected.

The Chief called on La Marr Brooks for last year's minutes, written by the former Secretary, Polly Hellams, which were read and approved. Registrar Bill Rawlinson reported that there were 26 in attendance on the Saturday tour to the BMW Plant at I-85. There were 34 in attendance at the Saturday night supper catered by Stoddard Catering. Which he added has been the average over the past several years with 130-150 average in attendance at the Sunday Reunion Meeting. Registrar Bill encouraged the younger generations to become involved in the Reunion Meetings as many of this generation go on to their reward.

New Business: The motion was made by Registrar Bill Rawlinson to give a suitable donation in an amount chosen by the Chief and the Treasurer in the memory of David and Mary Lou Garrett to the Fairview Presbyterian Church Historic Fund or the Cemetery Fund. David and Mary Lou Garrett were very active in the Stewart Clan and without Mary Lou we would not know a lot about Clark Berry Stewart. The motion was seconded and a suggestion of \$200.00 was made and accepted by Chief Charles to go to Fairview Presbyterian Church.

Chief Historian Mary Rawlinson reminded the Clan that Mary Lou Garrett was the author of **The History of Fairview Presbyterian Church**, which would be available in the Historical Building, after lunch, through James Rodgers for \$25.00.

Jack Pendarvis, co-historian of the House of John, presented "A Day in the Life of a Civil War Soldier" as our program for the day. He brought many artifacts of the period and contributed many bits of information concerning the Civil War that aren't normally considered.

As the meeting came to an end, Chief Charles announced that our previous Reunion Supervisor, John Henderson was in the hospital and could not be with us. The meeting ended with the Meal Blessing.
