Dear Stewart Descendants,

The Annual Reunion of the Walter Stewart Clan will be held during the weekend of August 12-13, 2000 at Fairview Presbyterian Church in Fountain Inn, S.C. We hope you will join us for the family sharing and tour on Saturday and the traditional reunion meeting and picnic dinner on Sunday.

We will meet at the Fairview Presbyterian Church community building near Fountain Inn for our Saturday morning registration, for the afternoon tour, and for our catered supper Saturday night. The reunion business meeting will be at Fairview Presbyterian Church on Sunday morning, with a picnic afterwards on the church grounds - or inside, in case of rain.

This year we will meet with the congregation of Fairview church for their 11:00 morning worship service and have our business meeting at its conclusion, with the picnic dinner at 1:00 pm. Fairview Church is asking its numerous reunion families to meet after the regular Sunday morning service, rather than at 11:00 am, to avoid disrupting their regular worship service.

Vans will be provided for those who would like to go on the Saturday afternoon tour. This year we will go to Pickens County to visit the Pickens County Museum and two old gristmills. One is owned by Rev. Leroy Stewart of the Pickens County Stewarts. Last year when he was our speaker, he issued a special invitation for us to visit his restored mill. The vans will leave earlier this year, at 10:30 am, to give us time for this very interesting tour. Our plans are to visit the Hagood Mill near Pickens first, where we will have box lunches in the picnic park. After lunch we will go to the Pickens County Museum which is nearby. Then we will go to Easley to Rev. Stewart's Golden Creek Mill. There is no admission charge for these attractions, but the museum welcomes donations. Stone ground cornmeal and other items are available at the mills.

Saturday night, we will gather for our family supper at the Fairview Presbyterian Church community building. This is a time of fellowship, renewing family ties, and sharing of family news and pictures. This year we want to try something new. Robert Hall and Judy Lesslie, your cousins in the House of Robert, will bring their computers for the weekend. They invite you to bring your old family pictures, which, as time permits, they will scan into their computers and make copies for you at a very modest cost. In return, we ask your permission to keep these pictures in our family records and possibly display them on our new Stewart family website. How wonderful it is to see the younger generation putting this new technology to use in preserving and adding to our family records.

We regret this year to report the death of Bill Rawlinson, our Reunion Registrar whose hard work behind the scenes helped make our reunions so successful. Bill's health had not been good for several years, but his sudden death from a heart attack seemed sadly premature.

The family historians ask that you continue to send in new births, marriages and deaths in your family. Please see the update sheets elsewhere in this newsletter for information on how to submit this data for your family.

We look forward to seeing you during Stewart reunion weekend to renew old ties and celebrate new ones. As it has for many decades, the call still goes out, bring a full picnic basket and join us!

2000 REUNION ACTIVITIES

Saturday Registration. Saturday activities will be at the Fairview Church Community Building across the road from the church (see map, page 3). Join us there Saturday morning for registration, informal introductions, handing in family update sheets, etc.

Saturday Tour with Box Lunch. Tour vans will leave from the Fairview Church community building at 10:30 am on Saturday, August 12 and return by 5:00 pm. If you plan to go, your reservations must be mailed by August 1 (see order blank, p. 6). We will visit three historical attractions in Pickens County: **Hagood Mill**, a restored 1825 grist mill with a picnic park where we will have box lunches, **Pickens County Museum**, a 1902 Victorian jail building listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and **Golden Creek Mill**, a fully operational 1825 grist mill that houses a country store and art/photo exhibit. No admission charge, but the museum welcomes donations.

Saturday Night Supper. This will be an informal catered supper at the Fairview Church community building Saturday at 6:30 pm. Bring the whole family, and pictures and family news to share with all of us. Older family members especially welcome! A buffet supper of baked chicken, side dishes and peach cobbler will be served. If you plan to attend the supper, please have your reservations in by August (see order blank, p. 6).

Sunday Worship Service at Fairview Presbyterian Church, 11:00 am. The service includes a children's sermon, after which young children are welcome to attend special activities in the Sunday school wing. The nursery is open for babies during the service.

Stewart Clan Meeting at 12:00 noon, following the worship service. Chief Charles Stewart will open the meeting and will ask for business reports and reports by houses.

Sunday Picnic Dinner at 1:00. No reservations necessary. There will be a goodwill offering to cover incidental reunion expenses. Bring picnic food to share with all. If you are coming from out of town, there are several restaurants and grocery delicatessens nearby where take-out items may be purchased. Ice tea and utensils will be provided.


Here you will see the impressive accomplishments of Webmistress Judy Lesslie, whose project last year was to get the Stewart records computerized and make them available on CDs and disks. This year, she has put up our Web site that includes excerpts from the Walter Stewart Family History, snippets from the newsletter, pictures from past reunions, and update forms for submitting births, marriages, deaths, and military records. She will be making other changes and improvements as time goes by so be sure to drop by from time to time. LaMarr Brooks has provided pictures from past reunions. There is an urgent need for families to help us identify all the individuals shown in the pictures (and to let us know if you don't want the picture on the Internet).

Judy has earned a huge vote of thanks from all of us for her donating her talents to this project. And I would like to thank each and every one of you who has made her work possible with your donations over the years for maintaining and computerizing our records. This has required investments in equipment and web space that would not have been possible otherwise. It delights me to see your generous gifts paying such rich dividends both now and for future generations.

Robert Hall, another computer-wise cousin, has initiated a project to get more old family pictures in the records. Here is his offer: bring old family pictures to the reunion, and he will scan them into his computer and print copies on the spot for a minimal fee (cost of materials only). In return, the digital picture goes into our family records for permanent safekeeping. Judy Lesslie has a digital camera that she wants to put through its paces to provide more reunion pictures for our website. Judy says she will provide digital copies of these pictures immediately on floppy disks for a modest fee.

Missing Stewart cousins still turn up from time to time, usually with the help of the Internet. The most recent ones have been the "lost" family of 1526 Benjamin Tillman Newman, a grandson of 15 Rachel Ross Stewart and Benjamin J. Newman of Fountain Inn. I encountered Benjamin Tillman Newman's great-great granddaughter, Sue Henry ("Chicago Henry, not Laurens County Henry," she said) on a Laurens County Internet maillist. She and all her family live in Colorado. The birth of Sue's little granddaughter, 1522613111 Noelle Kathryn Faut, is reported in the Updates pages in this newsletter. Little Noelle has the honor of being the first reported member of the tenth generation after Walter Stewart, who came to this country about 1788.

1999 Reunion Minutes

The 92nd Annual Reunion of the Walter Stewart Clan was held the weekend of August 7 and 8, 1999, at New Harmony Presbyterian Church in Fountain Inn, SC. Chief Charles B. Stewart opened the Sunday business meeting with Hymn No. 328, "What a Friend We Have In Jesus" accompanied by Martha Henderson, followed by the opening prayer and a short scripture reading. Before continuing to the regular procedure, Chief Charles shared the story of the Refrigerator, "Baby the Iguana" and the Smoking Log.

Chief Charles then requested members present from each house to stand for count. The states represented were South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Minnesota, New Jersey, Alabama, Virginia, Tennessee, and the country of England. The family that traveled the greatest distance was from England.

The youngest member in attendance was "Little Will" - William Tinsley Stewart, born 100 years and 3 days from the birth of his great grandfather, Chief 3171 William Tinsley Stewart. The oldest in attendance was 3734 Mrs. Sarah Stewart Godfrey.

The Chief Historian, Mary Stewart Rawlinson, accepted reports from each house for family births, marriages and deaths reported in 1998-1999. She then recognized visitors representing the Bobo Delegation and Chuck Bobo, President of the Bobo Clan, recently moved from California back to his roots in Huntsville, Alabama.

Chief Historian Mary Rawlinson introduced her daughter, Judy Lesslie, who reported on the Stewart Family History now available on CD in several formats such as Macintosh and Microsoft Word at the cost of \$30.00. Judy recognized those who helped in this accomplishment, ten year old niece, Chelsea Clark, who proof read line by line all numbers and names, assisted by her mother, Linda Clark. She also recognized her mother, Mary Rawlinson, who initiated the project and encouraged, coached and answered hundreds of questions.

A motion and 2nd motion were taken from the floor to extend a special thanks to Judy Lesslie and the Clarks for computerizing the family records. Mary Rawlinson also thanked her oldest daughter, Kathy Fields, for contributing the family numbering code system used in the Stewart book. Now that Mary has retired, she said her major project would be to update all the family files and make any needed corrections.

Judy Lesslie concluded by stating that she would be available to answer any technical questions and to collect email addresses to send information on the current web-site development.

Chief Charles opened the floor for other nominations, none given, motion was accepted to close. Vote was taken with the acceptance of all those nominated.

The Secretary read minutes from the 1998 Reunion, and motion was taken to accept the minutes.

Registrar Bill Rawlinson, reported that 36 attended the Saturday tour to Bethany Presbyterian Church and Cemetery, Sandy Springs Methodist Church and Cemetery and to Harold McClintock, Jr. and Susan Simmons' The Homeplace Garden Center in Ora, SC. Attendance at the Saturday night supper was 39. Bill Rawlinson also recognized that for the first time in many years the house of David Bobo Stewart was represented. Six out of the seven houses were represented with only the House of James missing.

Kenneth Farrow gave a report from the floor on the results of tracing the roots of Walter Stewart to this country from County Antrim, Ireland. The commercial researchers failed to find a Walter Stewart who could be identified as our ancestor.

Secretary LaMarr Brooks introduced the speaker for the Sunday meeting, Rev. Leroy Stewart of a Stewart line from Liberty, SC. Rev. Stewart, a retired Baptist minister, spoke on the Golden Creek Grist Mill that he has restored and currently operates in Easley, SC. He is a member of SPOOM, the Society of Preservation of Old Mills that traces old gristmills and millers. He presented the video he helped produce for PBS on old gristmills. He had a great deal of knowledge to share not only on gristmills but also on the history of our area, the battles fought here and the men of those battles.

The meeting concluded with the Meal Blessing.
